#### STANDING AGENDA ITEMS

Minutes of April 29, 2021: Adopted as circulated

**Safety:** Bears are becoming a concern

#### **Status of BCCFL Operations:**

- 1. Felling of roaded block in east Salloompt completed.
- 2. Supporting Nuxalk Forestry logging operations by storing their wood at booming ground.
- 3. Logging trucks going down the road are from Nuxalk Forestry's operations in Talchacko.
- 4. Operations at Noomst anticipated to start later this week.

## **2021 Operations:**

- 1. Noomst complete remaining block in June
- 2. East Sallompt complete roaded block, develop new road & blocks May September
- 3. Lost Lake block on hold:
  - 1) BCRS met will support BCCFL decision
  - 2) Road needs improving and brushing, block revised to retain area with concentration of older trees.
  - 3) Some individuals have talked with H. Granander and found plan not as bad as thought, but some still not in favour of logging and some think it would be OK to proceed.
  - T. Hermance BCTA has been contacted by individuals opposed to logging.
  - 4) This would be a small but productive site for the BCCF suggestion was made to evaluate number of high-productivity sites as there are other sites that might be controversial inventory analysis is underway to identify low elevation old growth areas.

- 5) There are computer programs that can "visualize" logging modelling/GIS analysis to help with classification of forest areas (help with identifying old growth forest).
- 4. Nookliklonnik west, potential start in fall, working around CMT's and goshawk nesting, collaborating with Nuxalk Sustainable Energy group.

## **Longer Term Operations:**

- 1. Nookliklonnick east, old growth, recreation and cultural heritage concerns raised
- 2. Nooseseck valley large up-front development cost.

## **Forest Management Plan Updating:**

- 1. Community Forest Management Plan still in draft stage (will include input from BCCF Advisory Committee.
- 2. Community engagement.- suggestions for engaging community in long-range planning:
  - 1) Public engagement it was suggested that a poll or survey be held/circulated to determine support for BCCFL
  - stated that polls are more accurate (more random)
  - concerns raised about wording for either format.
  - 2) How does community feedback affect decision making? (not discussed)
  - 3) Facilitation to assist with public engagement:
  - still support for idea of "outside" facilitator to be used in public engagement process
  - several suggestions were made for companies that provide professional facilitators (H. Granander has contacted a couple possibilities)
  - discussed possible timeline of June/July.
  - 4) Virtual 'open house' session questioned whether this would be effective?
  - 5) Other means to engage mini-videos on Youtube, on-going newsletter etc.

## **On-Going Discussion Topics**

- 1. Governance: membership discussion:
  - 1) Discussion revolved around lack of participation at meetings and having alternates to help with that situation.
  - 2) Alternates would attend if member unable to attend.
- 2. Terms of Reference: structure of Advisory Committee
  - 1) TOR set up members of Advisory Committee as local, knowledgeable people representing a wide range of local organizations to provide feedback and advice to the BCCFL (no decision-making).
  - 2) Adv. Comm. structure has representatives of local organizations (wide range), up to 10 members on committee, with each organization providing a representative.
  - 3) It was suggested that Adv. Comm. request a representative from the Nuxalk Nation.

- 4) Some Adv. Comm. members no longer represent organizations that they were affiliated with so some discussion about having "Members at Large" on committee.
- 5) Criteria for selecting new members would have to be developed; as BCCFL and BCRS developed original criteria both organizations should take the lead in that process with suggestions from the BCCF Adv. Comm.
- 6) Suggestion made to update TOR H. Granander will draft document for review by BCCFL and BCRS and Adv. Comm.
- 3. Relationship between Adv. Comm. and BCRS:
  - 1) Concerns raised that BCRS is not being informed about Adv. Comm. meetings appointee of BCRS is receiving the minutes.
  - 2) Suggestion made that minutes be posted on webpage.
